Dear Ms Schulz,

Thank you for your interest in our town. We are very pleased to send you the following information on typical costs when visiting Dublin:

**Hostel prices** – You can find 10-bed dormitories for 13 EUR and 4-bed dorms for 15 EUR per person per night. Most hostels provide free WiFi, free linens and free breakfast.

**Average cost of food** – Casual meals like pub food and fast food cost around 12 EUR per meal. Save money by eating the local products at a farmer's market or picking up food for a picnic at a supermarket. If you cook your meals, expect to pay 60 EUR per week per person for groceries that will include pasta, vegetables, chicken and other basic foods.

**Transportation costs** – Dublin has a very good public transportation system. For travelling within the city, consider the Luas (tram). A ticket costs 6.80 EUR for unlimited 1-day travel and 24.90 EUR for unlimited 7-day travel. We hope this information will be useful for you. We are looking forward to hearing from you soon.


